You never know what will happen when you decide to take a trip to Kurseong, India! On this occasion Julie Frank, my fellow traveller and I have been asked to write you all on behalf of Cecilia and SOJASI and Morningstar family.

It is four years since I was here last and much has happened since that visit. It has been a time of change and upheaval. Fr. A. Has retired, SASAC II has been reborn as SOJASI with Cecilia as director and Nita as her assistant here on top of the mountain at Morningstar, their "family home".

We have had the positive experience of visiting both places. First, to see the gardens flourishing under their new caretakers, and later to go to Morningstar for entertainment, prayer and supper. There is something very special about Nepali young people. They can sing and dance in a way that is absolutely wonderful to Western eyes and ears. Then they turn right around at prayer time and create prayers for us all straight from the heart. We came away from Morningstar feeling so enriched in every sense.

I spent a year here in 1972 with my five children, in the days when Fr. A. was principal at SAS. I taught English four periods a day to Class 5C.
